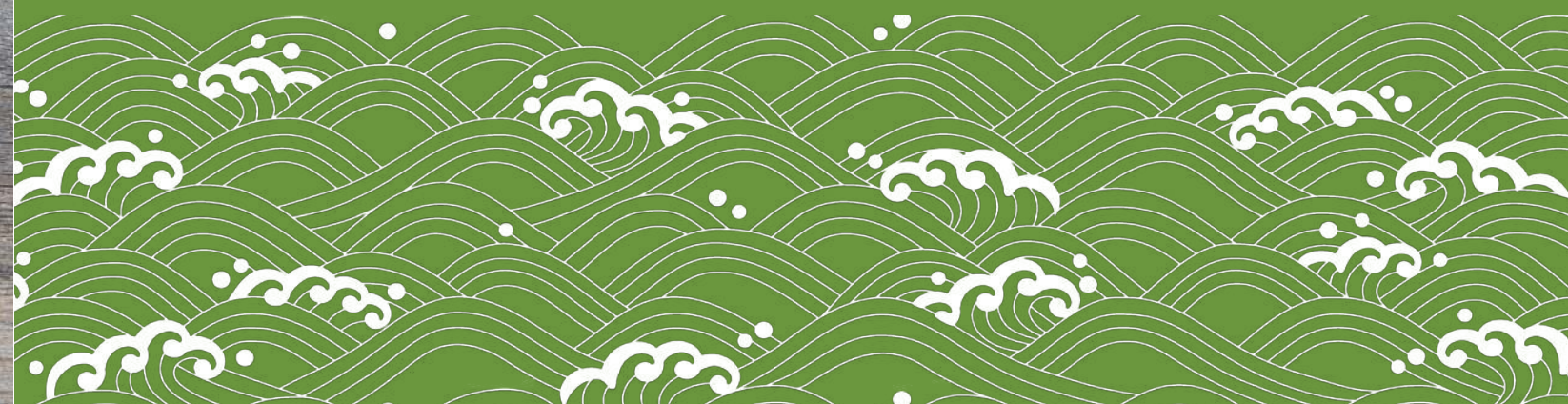

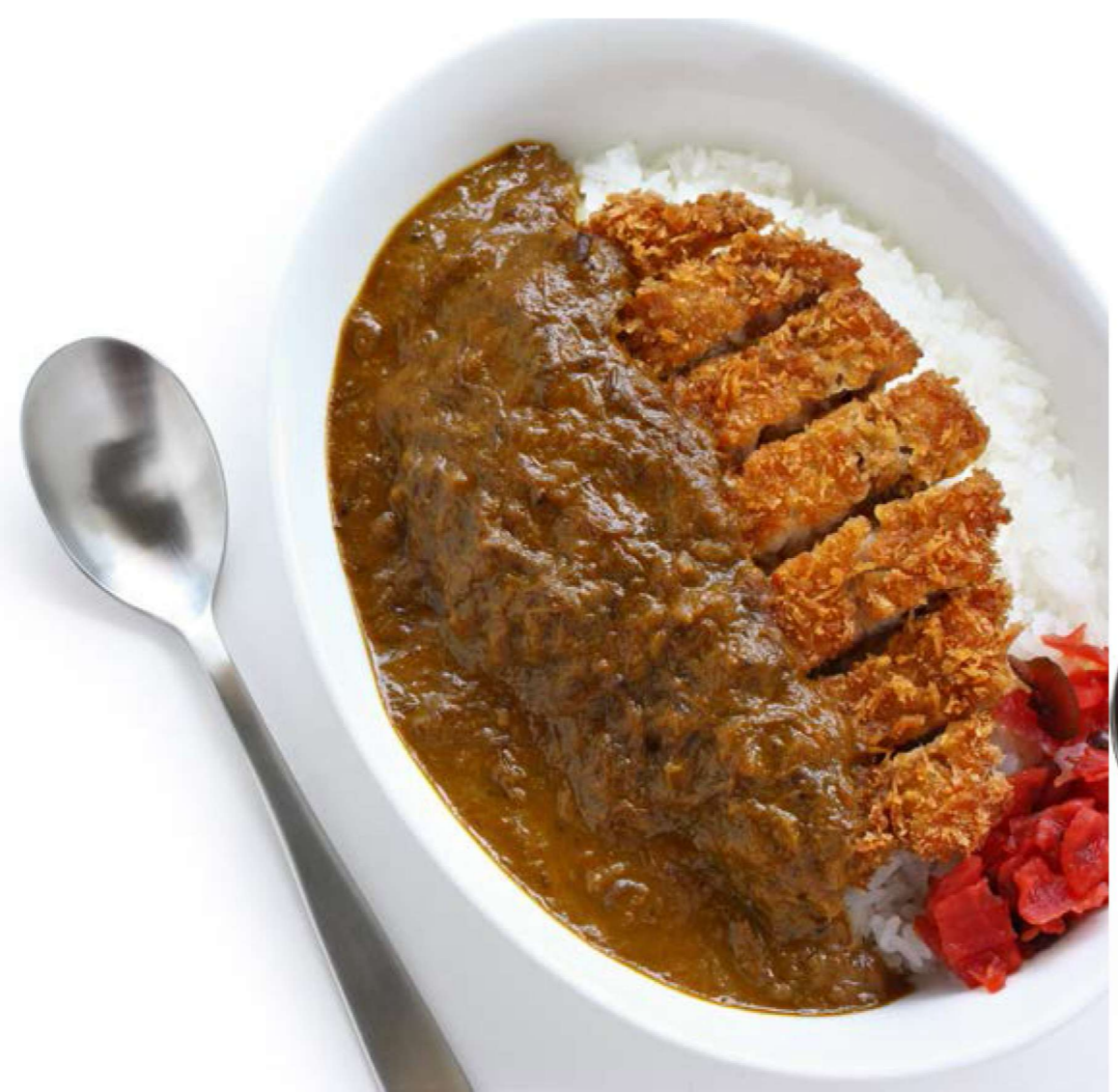

This is a not-so-great shot of my Calpis water and the Cheese Gyoza. [redacted] serves two types of gyoza, there's the regular kind, with regular insides, served deep-fried. And there's the cheese gyoza which has a melted pop of creamy cheese that bursts out right when you bite it. It's like the cheese hotdog of gyozas. Excellent! They serve this with a generous helping of Japanese mayo and a typical order has 5 pieces. Calpis water, on the other hand, reminded me of both Yakult and Pocari Sweat which tasted really refreshing, in my opinion. Liana didn't like hers so I ended up drinking two full glasses of it.



For starters, they got a ton of boardgames for you to check out in case you wanna try something out before buying your own copy, or just wanna have fun with a few friends.

Their menu's currently a work in progress, but improving! Current fave is the chicken donburi and vegetable gyoza. And they serve local and imported beers too!



Then there's the Gyoza (that kinda looks like an empanada!) It is so good. The outside is so crispy but compared to other gyoza's the wrapper is thicker thus making the gyoza crispier for longer.



If you could see it, the content is meat (no extenders!) and I think cabbage. Actually since the meat is full flavored, you wouldn't notice that cabbage has been there all along! (Great for kids who don't eat gulya!)
